White Ribbon walk success in Newport



On Sunday 25 November, we were joined by people from across Gwent to mark the United Nations' International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women.

The walk started at Llamau's Stow Hill Offices with a talk from Newport AMs, John Griffiths and Jayne Bryant. Attendees then walked a mile to the Riverfront Theatre, where there were presentations from Detective Inspector Chris Haire of Gwent Police and members of The Brothers, a Charter Housing and Bron Afon partnership group.

Particular thanks go to Michele Parker of Llamau for her organisational skills, the Riverfront Theatre for hosting and making us feel so welcome, and to Lubas Medical for their first aid support on the day—luckily nobody needed to make use of their services during the day. Focus on 'Honour' -based violence

'Honour'-based violence (HBV) can be distinguished from other forms of violence, as it is often committed with some degree of approval and/or collusion from family and/or community members.

Before accessing support, victims at risk of HBV experienced abuse for two years longer (five years compared to three years) than those not identified as at risk of HBV.

Nearly a quarter (23%) of victims at risk of HBV were not eligible for most benefits, tax credits or housing assistance. In total, 68% of victims at risk of HBV were at high risk of serious crime or homicide, compared to 55% of those not identified as at risk of HBV.

Victims at risk of HBV were more than 7 times more likely to be experiencing abuse from multiple perpetrators (54% vs 7%) compared to those not identified as at risk of HBV.

This gave professionals from across Gwent the opportunity to think about their approach to the people they work with and showed how each one of us has the ability to make a real difference to people's lives.
